Our speaker this month is Mike Allen with *'What Environmental Archaeology Can Do For You'*. Mike is one of the country's leading geo and environmental archaeologists, working in the both the commercial sector and academia. His archaeological specialism is the study of the environment and the human impact on it, especially via soils, sediments and snails. As the former environmental manager at Wessex Archaeology, he set up their environmental department, and since 2007 (operating as Allen Environmental Archaeology) he has worked on commercial and research projects at Stonehenge, Avebury, Malta and across southern England. Mike has published more than a dozen books, including the recent textbook "Molluscs in Archaeology". He is an Editor of the Oxbow Series "Studying Scientific Archaeology" and "Insights in Archaeology". Mike recently appeared in the "Digging for Britain" TV series, talking about his part in the dating of the Cerne Abbas Giant hill figure in Dorset (Episode 5, Series 9, first broadcast in January 2022).

Dr Neil Faulkner: obituary & Tribute.

22 January 1958 –4 February 2022

It is with immense sadness that we share the news that Neil has passed away. This happened peacefully during the early hours of Friday 4th Feb at University College Hospital, London, aged 64. Neil had been battling with a rare and aggressive form of blood lymphoma, since the summer of last year.

Neil was educated at the Skinners' School in Tunbridge Wells, he read political economy at King's College, Cambridge and was a teacher for a number of years before turning to archaeology, and taking his doctorate at the Institute of Archaeology, London, with a study of late Roman towns.

Neil was an archaeologist and historian who specialised in the Romans and Anglo-Saxons, he also helped pioneer the study of Modern Conflict, and Cinema archaeology. Neil carried out fieldwork in Sedgeford Norfolk, with SHARP, (the Sedgeford Historical and Archaeological Research Project) from 1996 where he was Project Director and remained involved until his death. Neil excavated also in Jordan, Italy, Ireland, Slovenia, and Spain.

Neil was a prolific author and breadth of his knowledge and interests can be seen from the sample of some of his books listed below. He was also the author of countless magazine articles and numerous academic papers,

Neil worked on various T.V programs such as Time Team and Timewatch (Zeppelin: The First Blitz) (retracing the footsteps of Vercingetorix). He had a long association with Current Archaeology where he worked as contributing editor, Military History Matters serving as Editor and Current World Archaeology where he had a regular column.

Neil also worked for Andante Travel leading tours such as Pompeii, Herculaneum & Classical Campania, Tunisia - The Punic Wars and Classical Sicily.

Within academia Neil kept up his teaching as a Research Fellow, in the Archaeology and Anthropology Department, at University of Bristol.

It would not be right to have any tribute to Neil without mentioning his politics. He was a Hegelian Marxist, and a long-standing member of the Socialist Workers Party, from 1980 to 2010, in 2020 he was on the co-ordinating committee of Anti-Capitalist Resistance.

To old time WEAG members & longstanding friends of Copped Hall, Neil will be remembered as fundamental part of the archaeology project in its early years. A larger than life character, Neil was opinionated, learned but always approachable and willing to share. There is no doubt that his knowledge and enthusiasm as well as his

high regard within the archaeological world and the experience and reputation gained from the SHARP project did much to help establish the CHTAP project in its early years.

A serious and erudite man always wishing to inform and educate, he was not above sending himself up as can be seen from the still from Grime Team (a spoof on the t v show Time Team) filmed at Copped Hall in which Neil played himself.

There are necessarily gaps & omissions in the biography of a man who achieved so much, but it is hoped that Neil would approve of this tribute from old colleges.

Our thoughts are with Neil's partner Lucy and their three children Tiggy, Rowena, and Finnian during this extremely sad time.
